

A few weeks ago, baseball players reported for Spring Training. For avid baseball fans, the arrival of the players at camps in Florida and Arizona is the first sign that spring is coming. We may be in the midst of winter gloom where we are, but our favorite team is beginning preparations for a new season. Spring will come.

During the weeks of preparation for the new season, the focus is on the fundamentals. Talented athletes return to practicing the basics of their sport – over and over and over again. They do drills to improve their motions as they swing a bat, throw a ball, catch, run bases, bunt, pitch, and run (good footwork in the outfield is essential).



GRAND VIEW UNIVERSITY CHOIR AT OUR LORD'S LUTHERAN

The Grand View University Choir will perform at Our Lord's Lutheran Church on Saturday, March 21 at 7:00 pm as part of its eleven-day 2020 Spring Tour through Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, West Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, and Alabama. The Grand View Choir tours extensively throughout the United States as well as regularly in Europe. Wherever they sing, they have been praised for their excellence in musicality, blend, programming, and attention to detail.

The cornerstone of the tour program is Randall Thompson's magnificent choral cantata, The Peaceable Kingdom. In it, the composer draws from the book of Isaiah to run the gamut from the destruction and clearing out of all that stands in the way of peace to the breath-taking beauty of the true Peaceable Kingdom. Other exquisite choral works, by Orlando Gibbons, James Fritschel, Rene Clausen, Kyle Pederson, Elaine Hagenberg, Larry Fleming, Kim Andrew Arneson, and others, echo and amplify this theme of peace.

Dr. Kathryn Pohlmann Duffy is the Chair of the Grand View University Music Department and director of the Choir. She holds degrees from Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa; Kansas State University; and the University of Chicago, where she earned her Ph.D. in musicology.

PROPERTY MATTERS

THE HEAT IS ON

When I arrived at Our Lord's last summer, I was very pleased to see how well our congregation uses the property we have. Both buildings are regularly utilized by congregational and community groups. Over these months, I have discovered that not everyone in the congregation knows about the activities and ministries for which OLLC is home base. And since it costs money to heat the Worship Center and the Life Center, I think it's important that you know what is going on in our buildings when the heat is on.

The heat is on in the Life Center on Mondays so that Questions Bible Study can focus on learning about the Bible, faith, and the world. The heat also allows your office staff and pastor to hold a Monday staff meeting and to work on bulletins, newsletters, and many weekly tasks and special projects. When people drop by for conversation or counseling, they don't have to choose between shivering or staying in their coats. And on Monday evenings, groups like the Council and the Transition Team can have their monthly meetings.

Over in the Worship Center, on Monday afternoons the heat is on for the Illinois Global Arts Academy (which is also in the Worship Center on Wednesday, Thursday, and Sunday afternoons). The Steering Team meets once a month down the hall. Tuesday is when the Praise Band rehearses. On Wednesdays, Bible Crunchers studies together and the Choir practices. On Thursdays, the Bell Choir holds its rehearsal.

On those days in the Life Center, there are weekly meetings of Narcotics Anonymous and Nar-Anon. On Thursdays, the OLLC Morning Glories holds their study, Office Angels put together the bulletins, and in the evening, one of our book study groups meets. (Another book study group meets monthly on Mondays at lunchtime.) Over the days and evenings, congregational ministry teams have meetings in both buildings. So do outside groups. And of course, on Saturdays and Sundays, the heat is on in both buildings as classes learn together and the congregation engages in worship and fellowship. So, thank you for keeping these buildings usable for the staff, ministry teams, community groups, and me. Your regular offerings make all the difference!





The Importance of CFIA Services in Our Community

Do you know someone who is an older adult or an adult with a disability? Many of us can think of at least one person that we know. Does this person struggle to get out of their home? Or, maybe they only get out from time-to-time to go to an appointment, get groceries, or run a necessary errand. Interaction with others is important for one's well-being — not just older adults and adults with disabilities.

The programs and services offered by Collinsville Faith in Action are crucial for the well-being of those that we serve. With a kind heart, and a warm smile, our volunteers are helping connect individuals to others, getting care receivers to medical appointments, assisting with grocery shopping, and reaching out with phone reassurance calls. There are often bonds formed and potentially life-long friendships that are made. A warm smile from a CFIA volunteer or friendly small talk could be just what the care receivers need to bring them a glimpse of comfort in whatever challenges that they are facing. Also, it is often said among our volunteers that the heart-felt benefits of providing these services is as great a reward as knowing that they are helping someone in need.

Collinsville Faith in Action is in place to prevent isolation and loneliness as well as to help individuals maintain and/or improve their quality of life. We offer all of our services at no-cost to the care receiver, and each one of our volunteers goes through background and reference checks prior to becoming an active volunteer. These screenings are in place to bring the best possible quality of service that we can. It also brings added comfort to the care receiver and his or her family. We are grateful for the opportunity to provide programs and services that can meet these needs for the individuals, and for the community as a whole.






