

MARK'S ANSWERS



MARYVILLE OUTREACH CENTER

The Food Pantry, Grandma's Attic and the Residence Assistance Program have been closed at least until the end of June. You will be notified when they will be open again. If you are in need of food, a Blessing Box (Food box) will be outside the Maryville Outreach building for you to come get food and will be restocked twice daily. If your need is greater than what is in the Blessing Box, you may call the Food Pantry and make arrangements to meet with the Food Pantry director. If you need help through the Residence Assistant Program, you may also leave a message for that.

But will you still be able to donate? YES! Please contact Glenda to make an appointment in which to drop off your donations! We are still helping people as the need arises, so your donations are still needed!



LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is supporting partners around the world during this time. Since January 2020, LDR-International has contributed over \$1.1 million in 26 countries in response to the pandemic.

- In Hungary, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Hungary is providing COVID-19 antibody test kits to test parishioners and staff. Staff and residents of church-run facilities and schools will be tested as needed.
- In India, Padhar Hospital will be able to better treat their COVID-19 patients through the purchase of a ventilator and multiparameter monitors.
- In Liberia, the Lutheran Church of Liberia is collaborating with the Christian Health Association of Liberia to provide medical supplies for hospitals and health centers throughout the country. In addition, they will provide counseling and distribute food to those affected by the pandemic.
- In Mexico, LDR is contributing to Grupo de Trabajo Mexico to support Casa del Migrante de Saltillo in providing food kits for migrants. Additionally, informational brochures will be delivered to these families and a sanitation tunnel will be installed at the migrant house.
- In Malawi, the Evangelical Lutheran Development Services and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi are conducting awareness campaigns and training Community Health Change Agents.
 Additionally, local artisans will be trained in making masks, sanitation supplies, and handwashing stations.

LDR is contributing to Church World Service's "Emergency Appeal: Coronavirus Fund". This will support CWS global relief and development activities including distributing food and hygiene kits and assisting education programs. Migrants and refugees are among the populations targeted with this campaign.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear People of God,

My new hairstyle reflects my state of mind lately. Since my hair hasn't been cut since February, it is more than a bit unruly. Without a headband to hold it down, it sticks out all over the place. My mind also goes off in all directions. It is hard to stay focused when there is so much to attend to. There are all the usual thoughts about worship rituals, office routines, and household routines. There is new information about opportunities to try new ways of doing things in all those areas. News about the world situation – both pandemic related and longstanding problems filter through my mind. But it's not just thoughts that demand attention. Many kinds of emotions are wedging their way in – pushing and pulling in an effort to be noticed. So, I have been trying to find a "headband" for my mind.

Maybe you are in a similar state of being. After all, the entire planet was exposed to the SARS-CoV-2 virus within a span of a few months. This coronavirus has forced us to make sacrifices. We made a huge number of changes in our daily routines. We gave up many events and pleasures. Which means we are feeling real pain, real loss, and real loneliness. And, at the same time, feeling intense concern for others who are in harm's way – physically or emotionally.

As all this tugs on us, what can calm us down? What can serve as a headband of sorts to pull us together? For me, it is prayer – especially sung prayer – that reorients me. By using the words of people who faithfully talked to God in the past, my own churning thoughts and emotions find expression. Many psalms, hymns, and recent songs have been recorded by individuals and congregations and are available on online sites such as YouTube and Vimeo. Those with a phrase that repeats frequently may be especially helpful as you center yourselves and invite God's presence to hold and sustain you.

These last few days it is a hymn by Isaac Watts that has woven its way into each hour. So, I close by sharing a couple of its verses with you:

O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home:

O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, still be our guard while troubles last and our eternal home. *ELW #632*

OLL RECEIVES GRANT/LOAN

Due mainly to the efficiency and persistence of our treasurer, Max Eakin, Our Lord's Lutheran Church recently applied for, and received, a loan of \$35,693 through the government's Paycheck Protection Program. This program originated from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The Paycheck Protection Program is meant to help small businesses (and non-profit organizations) maintain their payrolls through the initial stages of the current pandemic.

Loans secured by OLLC would typically need to be approved by our membership. This particular loan, however, does not qualify as typical. In the 8-week period following receipt of the loan, 75% of the loan amount must go toward employee salaries, with the remaining 25% going toward expenses that help keep our church operating. If these conditions are met, the original loan amount, along with any interest normally due, are forgiven and do not have to be repaid. Thus, this loan truly acts as a grant, provided we meet these provisions. This money will help Our Lord's continue to serve our community and congregation through worship and ministry.



MENTAL HEALTH BREAK

This is a time of resetting our expectations. We continue to be in a time of uncertainty. And the longer that goes on, the more likely we are to feel frustrated, helpless, or even panicked. So, as we try to live with the certainty of uncertainty, it is very important to be intentional about doing things that improve your mental health. Here is a quick list of a few things that improve emotional resiliency:

- **Stay connected** be intentional about having phone conversations with family and friends (and spend most of the conversation talking about something other than COVID-19).
- Express gratitude say (or write down) one thing you are thankful for at the start of each day.
- **Go outside** let nature soothe your soul. Look carefully at blades of grass, tree bark, flowers.
- **Dream** make some plans about what you would like to do in two years or three years, use magazines to make a collage of images that would be a part of your dream.
- **Mourn** do not neglect the power of your mourning. Tell God, or someone you trust to listen, about the losses you have experienced during this time. Mourning can lead you to a new morning (to a sense of energy and resilience for facing what is next).
- **Pray** the Holy Spirit works through our petitions and our praises. The Holy Spirit knows how to shape our worries into prayers. So, pause for prayer on your own or call someone to pray with you for 3 5 minutes.

CREATION CARE CORNER

Eating a plant-based diet is a huge contribution that individuals can make to slow the warming of this earth. That is so because if we grouped all the cows of the world together as if they were a country and put them in a list of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by Country, they would be 3rd on the list. Estimates vary, but livestock are responsible for between 14% and 17% of greenhouse gas emissions from human activities. So, consider trying out some plant-based recipes and/or some meat substitutes during this time when meat is not as plentiful due to the disruptions of the supply chain by COVID-19. You just might like it and discover that it is possible to do the world a favor by reducing your meat consumption in the future.
