In my life so far I have been a babysitter, a medical library clerk, a nurses' aide, a waitress, an enumerator for a city directory, a mail room assistant, a camp counselor, a hospital laboratory assistant, a researcher in biochemistry at a university, a hospital chaplain, and a pastor. In between or concurrent with those were additional jobs at fast food establishments including Taco Bell and McDonalds. And that's just the paid work I have done. I have also been a wife, mother, school fundraising coordinator, debate judge, interfaith-relationship advocate, and served three terms as a board member for an addiction and recovery services provider. What's your work history? I'd love it if you would email me a paragraph about the work you have engaged in up to this point in your life.

The word work refers to labor, activity, exertion, and effort to produce, accomplish, or affect something. The Bible has a lot to say about work. Although you might not know that, since for the last 40 years or more, the church in America has focused on what the Bible has to say about sex to the point of drowning out what it has to say about numerous other areas of life. There are far more verses in the Bible about work than there are about sex. A quick wordsearch on the computer came up with 697 references. The book of Exodus has the most to say about work, perhaps because the people who had once been slaves had to learn to regard work as a calling and a blessing instead of as a source of exploitation and injustice.

This month, my weekly video messages will explore our stewardship of vocation. Martin Luther became convinced that there is no one type of work that is closer to the heart of God than any other. Our mutual vocation is to love God and neighbor. May you use your gifts, skills, experiences, and passion to bless others, and may you find pleasure in doing so.




COOLING OUR LORD'S




CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY






