Our stewardship began with God moving down to us in love. In joy, we moved in toward God and toward others who were also open to receiving God's love. We found a place for us at Our Lord's. We learned to share our resources with one another because God called us to love. And then we looked outward, saw needs, formed partnerships, and gave of our money and time. That's what stewardship is about. Through our stewardship we love God and love our neighbors. So come and hear the stories, come and celebrate what God has done. November is a time of giving thanks. And we have a lot to be thankful for!

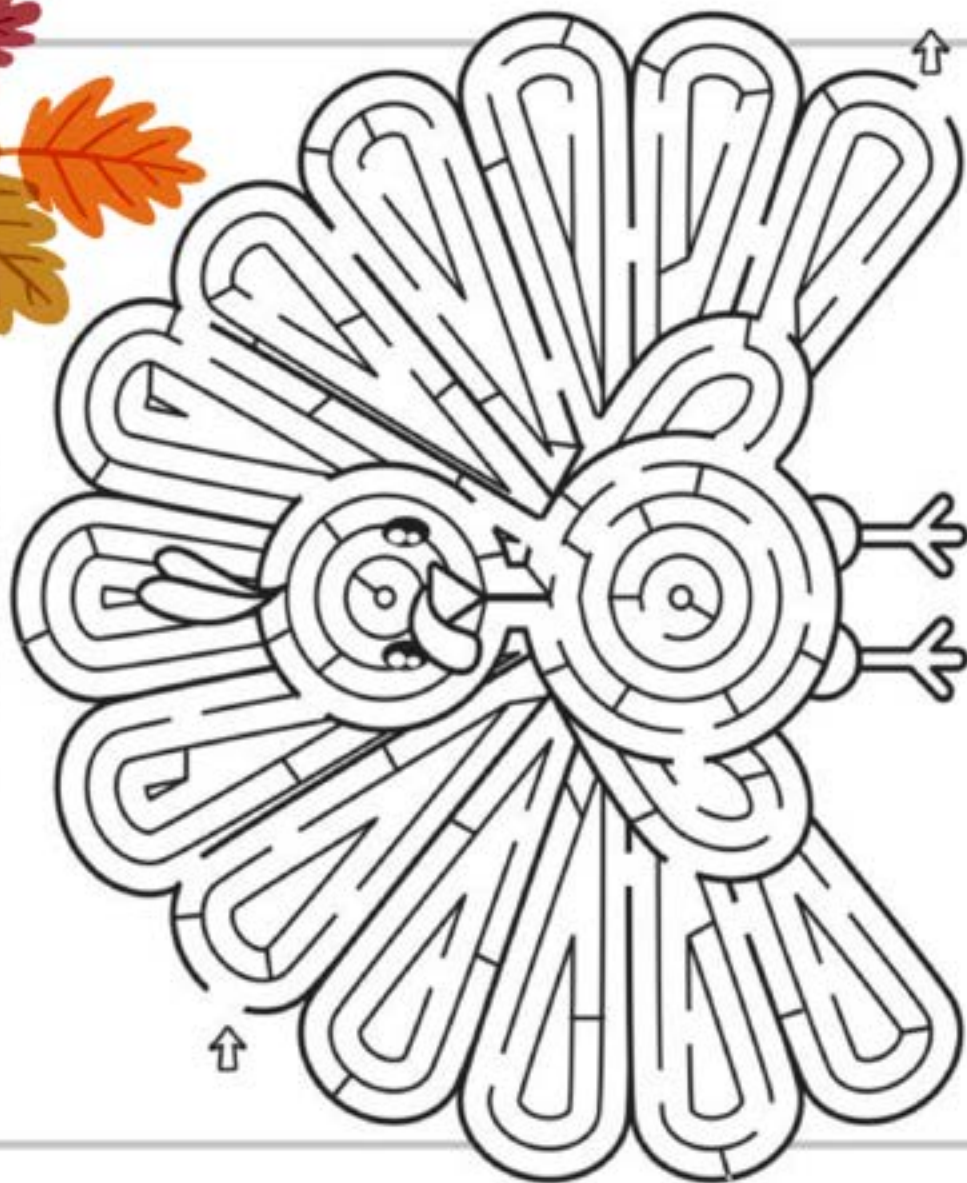

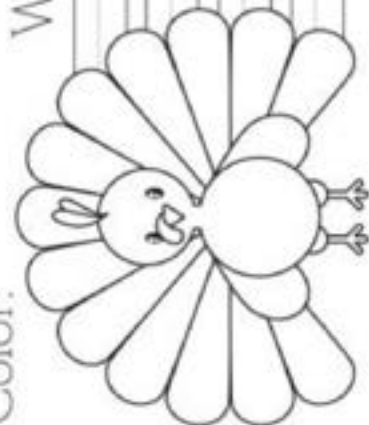


Turkey Maze
