A few years ago, my plane left Louisville, Kentucky just after 6 am on a winter morning. It was very, very dark. We had minor turbulence as we gained altitude and settled in above the clouds. I distracted myself by reading as I sat in a window seat just in front of the wings. And then, on the horizon, I saw a thin orange line separating the dark clouds beneath us and the slightly lighter deep blue sky above the orange light. Moments later yellow joined the orange and the sky above it moved to a light blue, above that was Advent blue, above that the deep blue of the night sky. I was awestruck. The unexpected view filled me with a sense of peace, and I breathed deeply and relaxed as I took it all in. The sunrise above the clouds spread until the horizon was filled with soft oranges and yellows with just a touch of pink as it met the ever lighter blue sky.

From the first moment I saw that thin orange line, I began taking pictures out the window. When I finally looked at those pictures, I discovered there were some things I did not see with my eyes when looking at the horizon. But the camera lens had captured the white light that followed the fading of the oranges and yellows. As we enter this season of Advent and prepare to celebrate Christmas, I wonder how much of the "light" God gives is not "visible" to us? We know there are many more stars in the sky we do not see than stars we are able to see.

There is light beyond what we are experiencing at the moment. That was true 2,000 years ago and it is true now. When the light of the world, our Lord Jesus took on flesh and was born as a baby, most people couldn't see the gift God had given. But a few people pointed to the light and over time a community formed to help others see this light of the world dwelling among us. Let's use these weeks of preparation for Christmas to help one another see Jesus.

DECEMBER GIVING EMPHASIS - CHRISTMAS WITH OUR NEIGHBORS

The relationship between Our Lord's and EU Well Care Home (formally Elmwood Nursing and Rehabilitation Center) began not long after OLLC moved to Wilma Drive in 1968. The ministry began when a group of church members offered Elmwood residents transportation to the church for worship and special events. Within a few years, "Christmas With Our Neighbors" was organized and the tradition of Santa visiting Elmwood on Christmas morning began and continues today. What started as a ministry to benefit the residents of Elmwood has become a ministry that warms the hearts of the entire congregation. A simple gesture of good will has developed into a relationship that has lasted more than 50 years.





The tradition of sharing Christmas with Our Neighbors will continue this Christmas season. EU Well Care Home has approximately 80 residents who have put together their Christmas wish lists. Before the end of November, a list of residents with their gift requests will be in the church narthex. Choose which resident(s) you want to adopt and sign up by providing your name and phone number. Then take the corresponding Christmas card(s) from the box next to the list. Each card will contain the resident's wish list and directions for preparing and returning the gifts to the church Narthex by December 22. The suggested contribution is \$20-25 per resident. Monetary contributions can be made through your established on-line banking, VANCO, by leaving a check in the donation basket or sending a check to Our Lord's Lutheran Church, 150 Wilma Drive, Maryville, IL 62062. Make the checks out to OLLC and write "Well Care" on the memo line.Any extra funds received will be used for other Well Care Outreach projects.

The cost to build ONE completely furnished home (w/plumbing, showers, etc) is \$160,000; one home houses 40 children. The cost to care for a rescued child on a monthly basis is \$100.




Adult Faith Formation: Understanding the Hebrew Bible -- Saturdays Starting January 18

Learn about the connection between Israel's story and Israel's theology as recorded in the Hebrew Bible ("Old Testament"), with an eye toward interpreting both Hebrew and Christian scriptures and theology today.

This Adult Faith Formation class will be led by the Rev. Dr. Fred Neidner and will be held via Zoom from 9:00 a.m. to noon on January 18 and 25, February 8 and 22, and March 8 and 22. The cost is \$25 for general learners and \$50 for synod-authorized ministry students. The Hebrew Bible ("Old Testament") developed over 1,000 years as Israel's canon of foundational literature. Each piece, whether story, law code, oracle, or song, had an intimate connection to a historical moment in Israel's history of living as God's chosen people. Since Jesus and the first Christians were observant Jews, Christianity and its scriptures (New Testament) are incomprehensible without some understanding of Israel's faith, identity, hope, and theology as these find expression in the Hebrew Bible. This course will probe the intricate connections between Israel's story and Israel's theology, with an eye toward how each is critical for interpreting both Hebrew and Christian scriptures and theology today.



All are welcome at Faith Lutheran Church, O'Fallon (520 East Highway 50), for the Advent series "Nativity Tapestries" for solo oboe. The series will feature the Rev. S. Blake Duncan, oboist, performing original compositions from Brenda Portman. Each instrumental piece is paired with the all-too-human experiences of the women of the Nativity. Two of the work's six movements will be performed each week, December 4, 11, and 18 at 6:30 p.m., pondering the mystery of the incarnation as it is grounded in the stories of Elizabeth, Mary, Anna, and more,

COUNCIL BRIEFS

"And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:10-11

This year the beginning of Advent coincides with the first day of December. For Christians, Advent is a season of preparation and anticipation for the birth of Jesus Christ. Anticipation is a feeling that we experience when we are expecting something to happen; it is an action of looking forward to something. Our anticipation for what lies ahead should always be colored by hopeful expectation and optimism. The key, is understanding the anchor of that hope; as Christians, our hope is in Jesus.

When I was a child I looked forward to the Christmas Eve services at Our Lord's. My family attended the early evening service. Afterwards, the seven of us including my grandmother, loaded into the car and drove through nearby neighborhoods to see the decorated homes and view Christmas lights. We would return to the church for the 11:00 pm worship; this 'midnight service' was my favorite part of the evening. The singing of *Silent Night* often brought tears to my eyes. Even as a young child I could feel hope and joy as we sung this hymn together.

During the November council meeting, I felt a sense of *anticipation* and *hope*. Following a discussion of church finances and a growing concern that expenses have exceeded monthly general benevolence giving for the past few months, the council remains optimistic for the future. Reports received from the Nominating Committee, Contract Renewal Team, and the Identity and Action Team indicated progress and highlighted tasks completed thus far. Of greatest importance was the progress made on hiring new staff (teams are still in the interview process, stay tuned) and the upcoming installation of solar energy on the Worship Center and the Life Center. As we discussed the future of OLLC we look forward to the months ahead with *anticipation*.

This Advent, I pray you experience the excitement and the anticipation of the season, that you leave behind the concerns of life, and fill your life with hope, peace, joy, and love.


During October:


