As January turns to February in this still new year, the need for prayers for the world, for friends and family, and for yourselves continues to grow. Thankfully, prayer is one of the central practices of Lent. It is part of how we return to the Lord our God. Lent begins on February 14th this year. You will find more details about the mid-week Holden Prayer services on page two. But right now, before Lent begins, I want you to join me for a moment in thinking about several forms of prayer:

- Prayer in response to wonder and awe at God's creation
- Whispered prayer in moments of weakness
- Prayer shouted into the darkness in the face of a terrifying calamity
- Pleadings at the bedside of a loved one
- Songs of gratitude for unexpected gifts
- Conversations with God at the end of the day
- Petitions thrown heavenward when we do not know what else to say or do
- Unarticulated prayers that bubble up from the depths of our being

These are just some of the types of private prayers we offer. There are also several kinds of prayer that help us listen to God, to hear what God is calling us to be and do. And then there are the prayers of the Christian community: the congregational worship prayers that both proclaim what God has done and ask for God's continuing action among us now.

There are many ways of praying. So, this month I am inviting you to examine your prayer life. Does it tie your heart to God and other people? If so, keep praying in the ways you have been doing. If not, try a new way of praying. God is listening and will answer our prayers according to his steadfast love.

"MID-WEEK LENTEN SERIES "Restored In Christ"

The season of Lent is a time for us to face together the brokenness of our lives and our world, and then turn that brokenness over to Christ so that we can be restored by him through the cross. Each service in this stirring series focuses on a certain event in the Lenten story and takes a good, hard look at a broken element from that particular story. Coming to an understanding of how each of these broken elements leads to restoration in Christ is key to understanding what it ultimately means to live today as new creations in Christ.

Ash Wednesday—February 14

"Broken Hearts Restored" • Joel 2:12-14 Our hearts are broken in sorrow over sin; Christ restores our hearts through his forgiveness.

Week 1—February 21

"Broken Vessel Restored" • Mark 14:1-9 A broken vessel holds costly perfume; we are broken vessels restored when Christ pays the price for us on the cross.

Week 2—February 28

"Broken Trust Restored" • Matthew 26:14-25 Judas breaks his trust with Jesus by betraying him; our broken trust is restored through the sacrifice of Christ

Week 3—March 6

"Broken Bread Restored" • John 6:48-58 Bread is broken at the Last Supper; we are restored through the Bread of Life, Jesus.

Week 4—March 13

"Broken Promises Restored" • Matthew 26:69-75 Peter's broken promises to never deny Jesus are restored by the surpassing love of Christ.

Week 5—March 20

"Broken Justice Restored" • 2 Corinthians 5:20-21 A broken justice system put Jesus on the cross; we are restored when we are declared not guilty.

FEBRUARY GIVING EMPHASIS: Souper Bowl of Caring/Kahok Strong February 1-11


In 1990, Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat." Since then, more than \$170 million has been generated for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring.



OLLC donations during **Souper Bowl of Caring** will go to **Kahok Strong** to provide funding for Collinsville High School seniors who have fallen behind in their lunch accounts.

Collinsville High School has 133 Seniors who will not be able to receive their High School Transcripts after graduation because of an outstanding balance on their lunch account. Without a high school transcript these students will not be able to attend a community college or university or join the military armed forces. The outstanding balance for CHS Seniors is \$3,794.74. Our Lord's February Giving Emphasis during Souper Bowl of Caring will be given to Kahok Strong to reduce the debt for these young men and women. **Funds in excess of our goal will be forwarded to the Collinsville Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen.**

ENDER FEBRUARY 14-March 31



February 14th to March 31st, the Giving Emphasis donations will be for ELCA World Hunger. ELCA World Hunger began in 1974 when drought, rising costs, and other problems left millions around the world in hunger, thus Lutherans in the United States started the World Hunger Appeals. Since then, more than \$650 million has been contributed for world hunger.

ELCA World Hunger's website states: "Amid rising costs, global conflict, the lingering impact of Covid-19, and intensifying effects of climate change, the world once again faces a startling rise in hunger that is undoing decades of progress." Not only does ELCA World Hunger (through people like us who give contributions) have soup kitchens and food pantries, but they also provide seeds, tools, animals, and education to grow their own food for families and communities.

Please pick up a daily devotional calendar and a study guide from ELCA World Hunger. The calendars and study guides will be located in the Narthex.

Each day, February 14th to March 30th, the calendar will have either a prayer, a bible verse, a hymn verse, info on giving, a quote, or encouragement to read the study guide that has information and questions. The calendar can be used by an individual or a family. The study guide also may be used by an individual, a family, or a larger group. The study guide talks about 4 places that ELCA World Hunger helped: a couple in Brazil, a youth traveling from Burundi to Croatia, a community in New Orleans, LA, and a group in Ethiopia.

COUNCIL BRIEFS

The start of a new year can be exciting **and** overwhelming. January marks the beginning of new possibilities, resolutions, and adventures. January is a time for reflection and setting the tone for the upcoming year.

The January council meeting began by recognizing Max Eakin for his five years of service as OLLC's treasurer.

Thank you Max for your dedication and serving on OLLC Council!

Following an update from the Ministry Support Team and discussion of administrative issues, we discussed the annual meeting, finalized a budget for 2024, and identified goals for the new year.

What will 'church' look like in 5 years? 10 years? What is God's plan for Our Lord's? How do we identify a course of action to fulfill God's plan? As you ponder these questions, reflect on the beginning of OLLC. In 1968 members were uncertain of the future of Our lord's when they signed a debt for \$148,000 to build the church building. At that time, the cost of a new home was \$26,600 and the median household income was only \$7,743! Again in 2006 when the church property was expanded and the Life Center was purchased, another substantial debt was undertaken. I may sound like a broken record continually bringing up the church debt but these events illustrate the perseverance of the members of Our Lord's. I am certain there was fear and concern each time the financial indebtedness was increased but the congregation did not let their fears or doubts guide their decisions.

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. *Jeremiah 29:11* (ESV)

As we begin 2024 and navigate the future of OLLC, I encourage you to let hopes and dreams, not anxiety or fear guide your decisions. Do not dwell on what or how things have been done in the past, but focus on the possibilities for the future..


