THE YEAR OF MARK

Many of our Gospel readings in worship will come from Mark this year. The Gospel of Mark is ancient. It was written in Greek around the year 70 C.E. The world it was composed for was an oral world. Often this book was read out loud to groups gathered around the storyteller. Very few copies of it existed and those were handwritten. So, people did not sit and read it silently.

The Gospel of Mark was written somewhere in the Mediterranean world and combines stories of and about Jesus. It is not an objective account of the historical Jesus. Those who have already been persuaded by the good news of and about Jesus are telling this story to persuade others. It is a story of people in conversation with God. It is a story of those who speak for God in conversation with those who are listening for God.

This book is fast paced, has dramatic contrasts, nestles stories inside of other stories, and moves from one scene to another abruptly and with little commentary. One of my seminary professors memorized the whole thing and told it to us. We got to hear it in one sitting. Mark wants us to hear. He wants us to hear who Jesus really is. He wants us to understand so that our lives may be transformed by the one who gave his life for us.

Jesus gave his life for us when he came to earth as a vulnerable human being. He emptied himself of his heavenly status and became humble. Then, walking among us, he learned how to form a community that shared its thoughts and struggles, hopes and dreams. Pay special attention to those disciples of his. Learn from them how to listen to Jesus and how to share your life with others.

JANUARY GIVING EMPHASIS

Souper Bowl of Caring/Kahok Strong

(at end of January through early February)

In 1990, Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat." Since then, more than \$170 million has been generated for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that transforms the time around the Big Game into the nation's largest celebration of giving and caring for those in need. Through this mission, people learn they can make a positive difference in the world as they collect food, raise money and serve at hunger-relief charities and show caring and compassion in local communities across the country.



Share in God's love for our neighbors in need and give generously on our Souper Bowl Days. Donations collect will go directly to Kahok Strong to provide funding for Collinsville High School seniors who have fallen behind in their lunch accounts. **Funds in excess of our goal will be forwarded to the Collinsville Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen.**

Collinsville High School has approximately 430 Seniors who are navigating many "lasts". Their last semester of high school, their last time to attend/play at sporting events or attend CHS club/extra-curricular activities and their last school dance/prom. In addition, to these "lasts" they are also trying to navigate the world around them, study for finals, and make their post graduation plans. 133 of those Seniors will not be able to receive their High School Transcripts after graduation because of an outstanding balance on their lunch account. For students who are not planning to join the workforce directly after high school this could cause an insurmountable roadblock to their future. Without a high school transcript these students will not be able to attend a community college, universities or join the military armed forces. The Giving Emphasis Team would like to help minimize the impact an outstanding lunch balance will have on these students' future. the outstanding balance for CHS Seniors is \$3,794.74. Our Lord's January special giving emphasis and the offerings collected at the **Souper Bowl Supper** will be used to assist these young men and women in achieving their post-graduation goals. SOS SPIRIT OF SHARING SOUP KITCHEN

The Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen's OLLC team was amazing in 2023. The total number of patrons served will be posted in the February newsletter. But regardless the number you did wonders for the Collinsville community. The meals served met the many known and unknown needs of our Father's flock. Your hands, your heart, your love -- all to HIS GLORY. Thank you to all who served, prayed for the mission or supported it financially.

We will not be serving Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen in January. We do have the tentative schedule for 2024. We serve in February, March, April, June, July, September, October, and December. So we will not serve four months next year January, May, August and November. The needs for the February meal will be posted in the Narthex by mid-January.

SERVING OUR LORD'S

SATURDAY & SUNDAY HOSPITALITY HOSTS NEEDED

There is just something about chatting and fellowshipping over food, whether it is snacks or a light meal. Face it: food brings people together. Additional hosts are needed for Saturday nights following the 5 pm service and Sunday mornings following the 9 am service. If you don't think you are qualified for hospitality because you are young, single, working, etc., you may want to team up and host with another member. Saturday nights are usually light suppers serving between 15-20 people. Sunday mornings consist of breakfast pastries, fruit, & cookies serving between 10-20 people.

What are the responsibilities of Hospitality Hosts?

- prepare coffee/cold drinks
- set out paper products (plates, napkins, plastic ware) on the food credenza
- clean up consists of cleaning coffee pots and airpots and return airpots to their location on coffee bar in Fellowship Hall.
- wash, dry, and return all items to proper location in kitchen/Fellowship Hall (Do Not Leave any Dishes/Utensils air drying on counter or in the sink)
- remove all trash in the Commons Area. Bags should be tied up and carried to dumpster located between shed and Elmwood Care Center or placed in large yellow container in Kitchen Area. Replace with new trash can liner (kept in the right cabinet in Credenza)
- wipe down all tables, food credenza, coffee/drink area, kitchen counters, stoves, etc.
- sweep floor if needed and spot clean chairs of spills
- dispose of all leftovers. Do Not place leftover food in refrigerator.

ANNUAL MEETING January 28 additional information sent out


