PASTOR'S COLUMN

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting."

Acts 2:1-2d

May is such a wonderful month. For those of us living in the Northern Hemisphere, the grass turns green, the buds on the trees open, and a whole array of flowers come into full bloom. But it's not just the earth that is filled full. This is the month of Mother's Day, proms, graduations, and the first picnics of the summer season. It is a month full of good things. I especially love the years when Pentecost falls in the month of May. I love it because Pentecost is about fullness. The wind of the Spirit sweeps into our life as a church and fills us. If you imagine the church as a boat crossing the sea of life then, it is the wind of the Spirit that fills our sails. The Holy Spirit is what makes it possible for us to move forward. When we are filled with the Spirit, we have the gifts needed to fulfill our mission to share Christ's love with all.

The question is: do we believe it? Do we believe God is indeed actively providing all that we need to be an active, vital congregation in this time and place? Long before the pandemic, many churches became more focused on what they did not have than on what gifts God had provided for this time in their life as a congregation. That tendency to focus on what we don't have instead of what we do have reminds me of an old story. A man who was visiting his uncle took him for breakfast at the uncle's favorite diner. The waitress brought coffee and the uncle took the three sugar packets on the saucer and emptied them into his cup. He tasted the coffee, waved the waitress over, and said, "more sugar." She gave him a couple more packets and hurried off to another table to take an order. The uncle emptied the packets, tasted his coffee, and motioned to the waitress again. As he said, "more sugar," she put down two more packets. By now the restaurant was filing up and as the waitress tried to zip by their table, the uncle stopped her again and said, "more sugar." She turned and said, "Stir what you've got."

Stir what you've got. Pentecost is about the wind of new life – a resurrection wind – blowing into our congregation and helping us to use what we've got. Our cup is full of sweet things. It's time to stir what we have. A place to begin is by coming together on May 19th for our church picnic at Willoughby Farm. This is the first all church picnic since before the pandemic. It will be a great time of seeing one another, sharing food, and having fun. Come catch the Spirit.

Companion synod relationships of the ELCA connect Lutheran churches throughout the world with ELCA synods and congregations. These relationships are concrete expressions of the communion and fellowship with the more than 140 Lutheran member churches of The Lutheran World Federation.

Through the program, companion churches and ELCA synods nurture and strengthen one another for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors and sharing of resources.

The companion synod for the Central/Southern Illinois Synod is the Malagasy Lutheran Church (two synods). Each year at the Synod Assembly an offering is gathered for our companion synod. This year, our Giving Emphasis Team is inviting members of our congregation to contribute to this offering in May. It will be taken to the June 6-8 assembly.



May is here. Think about sitting down to a nice cup of Equal Exchange Organic Tea or Coffee on a Spring, Afternoon or Evening. So many choices to choose from. Every purchase helps a Small Farmer to a better way of life.

Transforming the Tea industry

We are proud to support the <u>Potong Tea Garden</u> in Darjeeling, India. Once a colonial plantation, Potong is now collectively run by its workers, paving a stronger, more democratic path forward for the community. This revolutionary model generates significant improvements for the garden's 350 workers and their families, and is helping to spark a badly needed transformation of the tea industry. Most teas–even those that are certified as fair trade–come from large plantations where workers have little say and are trapped in a system of dependency. The small farmers who grow our teas control their land and their livelihoods. Together, we're building an alternative tea model and a farmer-led future for the tea industry.



Investing in Regenerative Agriculture

Human life on earth depends on healthy soil, abundant with nutrients and living microorganisms. Cooperatives like Manos Campesinas in Guatemala prioritize regenerative practices like building organic fertilizer production centers in the community, so farmers can use these resources to "feed" their land with the nutrients the soil needs, rather than depleting the soil through conventional farming methods. The co-op is also investing in farmer-to-farmer training programs, so neighbors can teach and learn regenerative practices from each other.

SOS COORDINATOR NEEDED!

Gail Jorgenson has been OLLC's coordinator for our work in the Collinsville Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen. After 7 years leading the team, Gail has decided to step back from the leadership role and will instead be serving in a more supporting capacity. Therefore we will need a replacement, or a team of replacements to continue our work with Collinsville SoS Soup Kitchen.

The position will requires the coordinator to announce the serving schedule to the church

membership, solicit volunteers for meal preparation and serving, set the menu, obtain the supplies needed for the meal, and lead the preparation and serving of the meal. OLLC normally serves on the second Tuesday or the second Thursday. While not every month, we do serve 8-10 times a year. There is a Coalition Member meeting every two months. For the interim Gail will take the meetings as the new coordinator(s) get their bearing working the serving effort. The SoS mission needs your prayerful consideration to meet this vacancy in our mission outreach efforts. Please feel free to contact Gail Jorgenson if you have questions regarding this request.

SOLAR UPDATE!

During the Congregation Meeting held April 20 & 21 with a total of 65 members present, the vote to engage in solar energy for OLLC passed.

47 yes, 9 no, 3 abstain, 6 did not cast votes

The next steps include: contact other churches in the area and within the synod that previously installed solar energy; contact references from each solar company (Day & Night Solar and Straight Up Solar); identify the solar energy installer--Materials used, installation processes, warranty coverage, and recommendations will be taken into consideration before a specific installer is awarded the contract; review and sign contracts--before signing contract(s) discussions with individuals experienced in contract language and negotiation and with church attorney Randy Steele will occur.

The Federal Tax Credit through a direct-pay process and Recoverable Energy Credits are anticipated to cover nearly 70% of costs. Project costs will not exceed \$122,000 (the cost identified by the Day & Night Solar proposal received mid-March). To recover the costs not covered by the tax credits, we will run a three month capital campaign. The goal of the campaign is to increase giving beyond regular benevolence giving by \$35,000 during June, July, & August. OLLC will be 'selling' solar panels! More information regarding the capital campaign will follow in the June newsletter.
